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PARSONS EARLY HEAD START ENROLLMENT

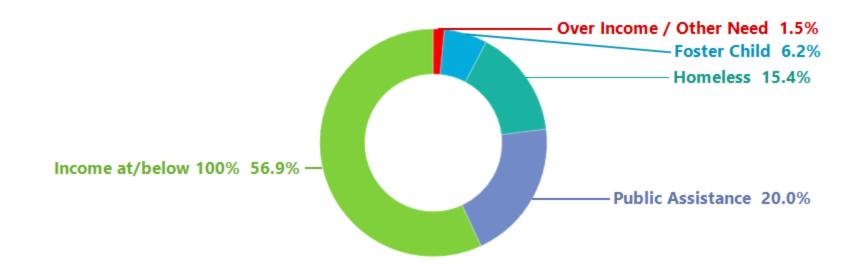
- Parsons Child and Family Center, a program of Northern Rivers Family of Services, provides Early Head Start (EHS) services to pregnant women and families with children under the age of 3 who live in Schenectady County and are at or below federal guidelines for poverty
- Funded Enrollment of 94 children: 22 served with a Home Visiting Model and 72 served with a Center-based Model in 9 classrooms located at 125 Bigelow Avenue, Schenectady, NY
- Total number served: I 14 Children, 9 Pregnant Women
- Average monthly enrollment (August 2021-August 2022): 88 children*
- The average monthly wait list was 98 children over this 12-month period

^{*}Program enrollment was negatively impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic. Fewer children were enrolled in classrooms due to the need for social distancing and to ensure the health and safety of children, families, staff and the community.

Enrolled Participants by Eligibility Status

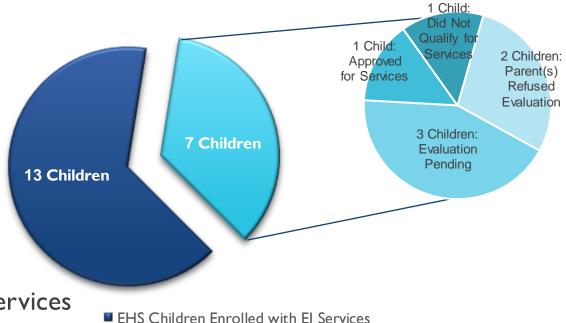

 - 1 evaluation is completed, child did not qualify for services

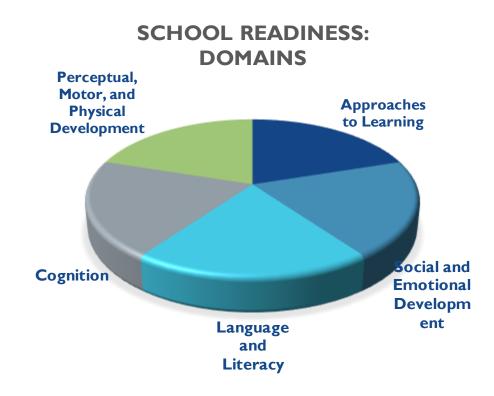

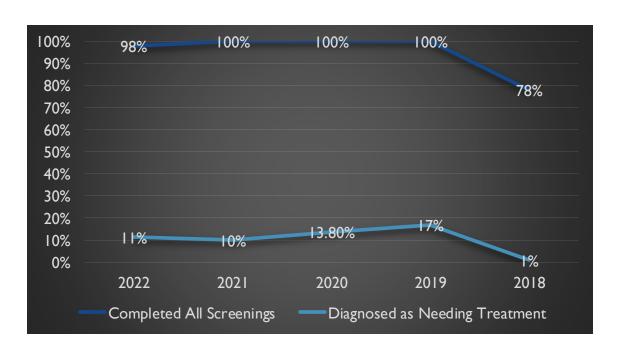

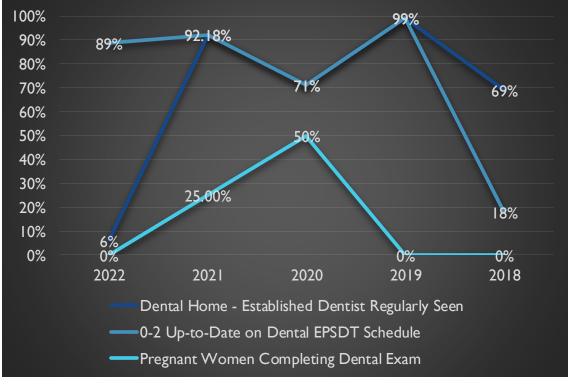


ENROLLED CHILDREN RECEIVING MEDICAL AND DENTAL EXAMS
